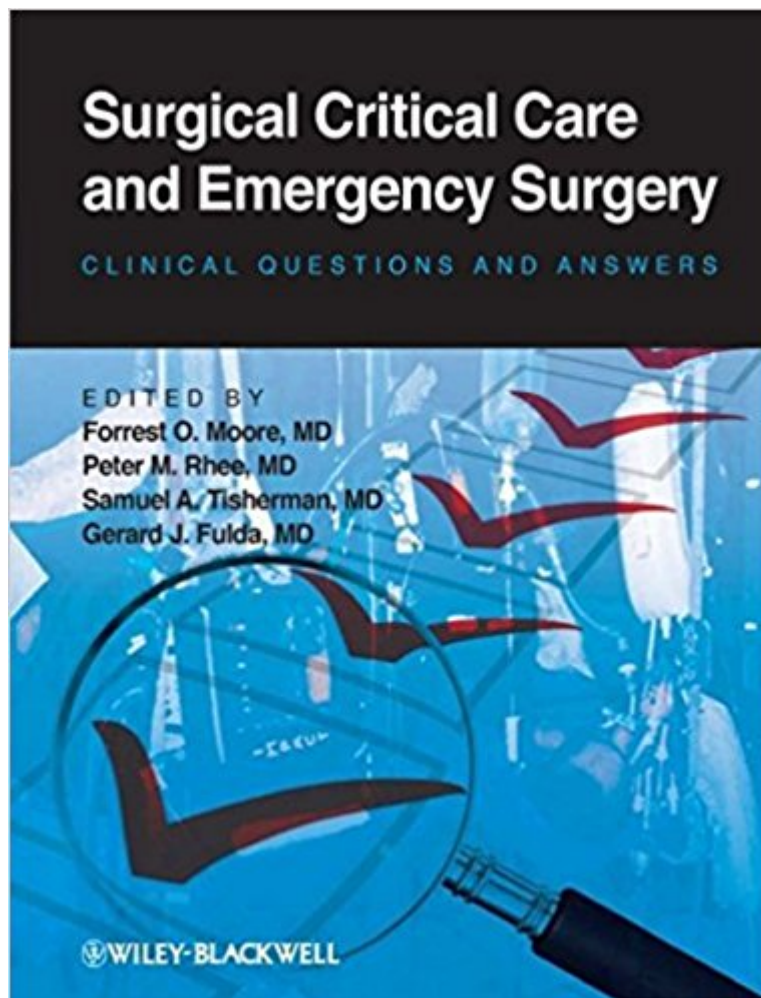

These are clearly well thought out questions and thoroughly researched answers that I would strongly recommend to every practitioner of Surgical Critical or Trauma Surgical Care especially those that are preparing for Certification or Recertification examinations. There are however a few instances in which the justifications put forth for the "correct" answers rely on information not included in the question. There are also instances in which multiple equivalent answer options are given in the multiple choice format. For example in regard to Chapter 4, Question 17, I contend that options (A) and (B) are equally true and considering the framing of the question (the key word is "early"), one could defend selecting answer A over B. Just nit picking but otherwise, this is an excellent and helpful teaching booklet.

The new book by Forrest Moore and Peter Rhee is well organized and has excellent board style questions that will be helpful for certifying or re-certifying in surgical critical care. Answers are well referenced. The only downside is a few misspellings are noted. This book is recommended as an excellent study tool for preparing for your boards.

I used this and the SCCM publication. This book is tailored for the SCC exam, whereas the SCCM book is useful but is more for MICU types. The first half covers SICU topics, and the second half

goes over trauma/ACS topics, which is about the same breakdown as the exam. It's a good review for trauma treatment in fields that general surgeons don't usually focus on (ortho, urology, etc.). My main criticism is that the questions are unnecessarily difficult because of the way they are written - most are of the "which of these is/is not correct" variety, which is extremely confusing. I don't really care since this is just for studying, and because it was probably the easiest way for the authors to cram the questions full of info, but I will note that the ABSITE, ABS gen surg written boards, and SCC exams all use much more straightforward wording that is designed to take that ambiguity away. So if you're messing up all the questions because you forgot if you were supposed to be picking the true or false answer this time around, take heart.

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
