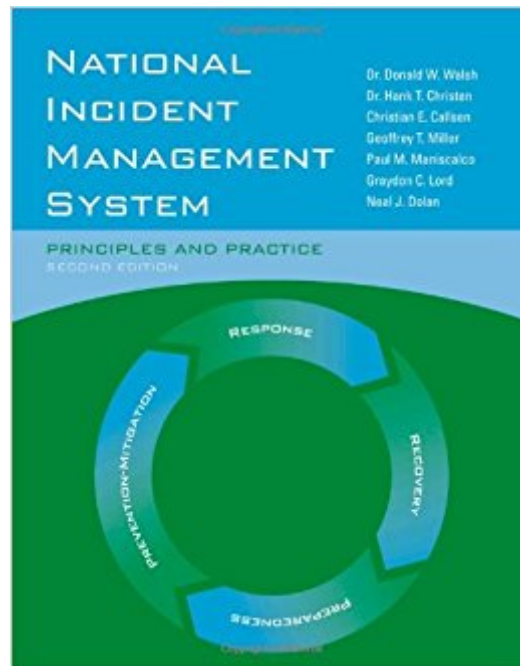

I am taking a series of grad courses on emergency management (EM) and this book has been extremely helpful in understanding how the US does EM. The National Incident Management System (NIMS) is the key to understanding the complete EM structure in the US, from the national level to local communities. Different books allude to how the NIMS concepts and philosophies emerged and are practiced. However, this book is the only I have found that is singularly focused on the complete NIMS system. I wish this was assigned as a textbook in my initial EM classes. Regardless, I now use it as a detailed book on NIMS and as a reference book for my last 2 classes on NM.
