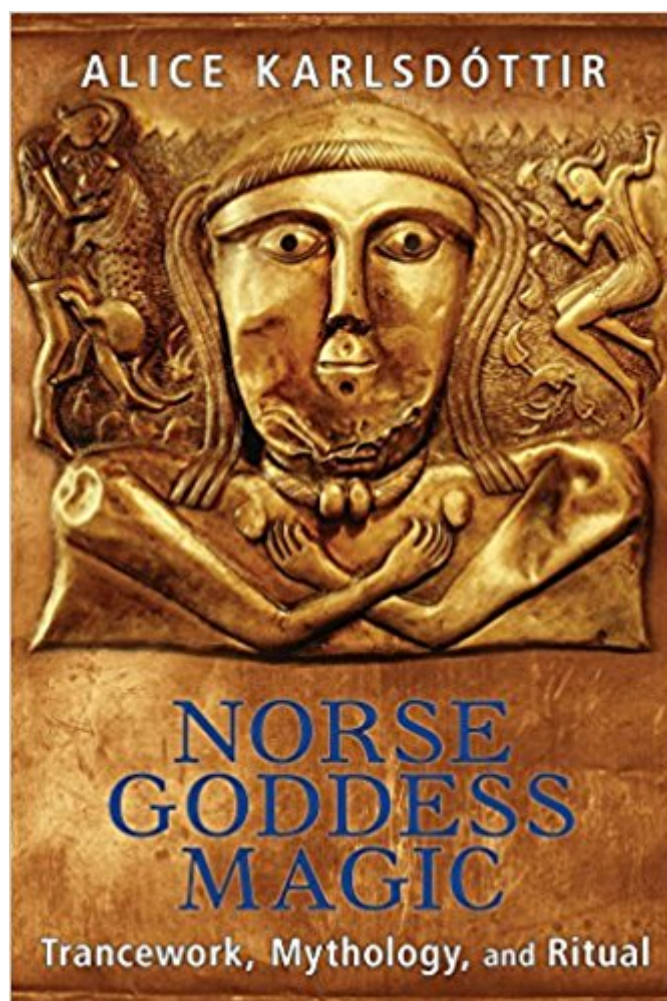

She shares their appearances in the Eddas and Germanic mythology and explains the meanings of their names, their relationships to each other, and their connections to the roles of women in Old Norse society. She provides detailed instructions for invocations and rituals to call each goddess forth for personal and group spirit work. She also offers a comprehensive guide to ritual tranceworking to allow anyone to directly experience deities and spiritual beings and develop spirit-work relationships with them.

Info on the goddesses was ok. Her thoughts on trance work, though, are messed up. DO NOT use this for beginning trance work. You should learn/work towards being able to go into a trance no matter the circumstances whenever you need to. The author admits that trance is difficult for her to get into. Fine. She then gets into a chapter of do's and don't putting restrictions of when and how one should go into a trance. Only in certain weather, times of the month, times of day, etc. Putting these restrictions on trance work is putting yourself into a box, that once in, would be hard to expand out of. And isn't trance all about expanding yourself?

Excellent book for starting to look at and reach out to Frigg and her women. A good book to help one dive into lore (with additional research) and get started on making connections with the goddess. I highly recommend this read.
