

I was wondering what types of fruit-bearing trees you can plant and my questions were answered. When you plan your hydroponics garden, the author has some tips for you. The author's writing style is easy, smooth, and casual which makes the book an easy read. Wait, thereÃ¢â€¢s more. You can read about water maintenance, garden expansions, and common mistakes newbies make, troubleshooting, and even tips from the experts! The book is filled with a lot of information and did not bore me with unnecessary information. Everything you need to know about this kind of gardening are all in the book. It is a go to reference book for hydroponics.

This book is seriously underwhelming. Filled with general, vague descriptions and very little useful instruction. Almost everything I read can be gleaned from a hour or two of independent research on the internet, and some information is just plain wrong. At one point in the chapter dealing with planning the garden, the author indicates that tropicals are zone 1 plants. Anyone capable of

reading a hardiness map would know that assertion to be about as wrong as saying cacti require heavy, daily watering. The book reads like an horoscope: statements crafted to be as broad and applicable as possible, an amalgamation of careless research and opinion with very little meat on the bones. I'd recommend this only to people who refuse to do even the slightest amount of independent research. The very fact you are reading this review shows you to be capable of more meaningful research on your own, so save your money for hydroponics gear and look elsewhere for advice.

With hydroponics, the roots of the plants will actually grow right out of the pot, allowing the plant to get as big as it likes. Or at least as big as it can before you eat it!
