

This book, written in 1987 is a must read for the world we live in today! This is a deep, wonderful, and yet sad book about where we have been and what has happened to us. This book is one of the few that stops ignoring the elephant in the living room of archaeology and anthropology! The evidence has been there for decades, but nobody ever puts it all together and states what is clearly obvious -- that the earliest human societies weren't patriarchies (or matriarchies), and that societies weren't always ruled by men who used threats of violence to enforce their will on the populace. Whether you're looking at Catal Huyuk thousands of years ago or the Arawaks met by the first European explorers in the New World a few centuries ago, it's clear that extreme divisions of power, labor, and wealth are not the baseline state of human society. The author doesn't try to suggest that these cultures were completely peaceful, of course, which is one of the false claims I've seen about this book. It's good to know that humanity hasn't always lived under authoritarian men who dominate others and rule by the threat of violence. If enough of us knew that, the future would be much, much brighter.

Was given this book by a student who told me she was assigned to read it at her University. Though it is from a scholars perspective, almost a documentarian device, I felt very connected to the history and current affair of women/men in the social, emotional and cognitive development and how we find ourselves interacting today and what is possible for tomorrow if we learn from our past. Every person should read this book as an insight to the male /female relationship and its potential. Futurists do our world a great service by asking us to move ahead of the curve rather than staying in the status of today.
