




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# The Environmental And Genetic Causes Of Autism



## Synopsis

The Environmental and Genetic Causes of Autism delves deep into the full body of past and current research to reveal how genetic predispositions and environmental factors can combine to produce the conditions autism and autism spectrum disorders (ASD). To make this groundbreaking volume, Dr. James Lyons-Weiler combed through the past fifty years of published research on autism, exploring subjects such as genetic variation, mechanisms of neurotoxicity of metals and pesticides, and the central and combined roles of each in causing autism. Lyons-Weiler provides a major overview of all aspects of the condition of autism, reviews changes in diagnoses and treatments, and explains how genetic information can be used to tailor effective treatments, and sometimes reversals, of the symptoms. He also presents practical forward-looking suggestions on how to design future studies to facilitate the discovery of biomarkers for autism risk and how to classify the full range of autism spectrum disorders. Autism is considered one of the most mystifying conditions of our day, and alarmed scientists, doctors, politicians, and parents are desperately trying to understand why the condition is escalating. According to the CDC, rates in the United States have risen from an estimated one in two thousand children in 1980, to one in sixty-eight in 2012, and a new National Health Interview Survey shows a rate of one in forty-five. By the time you read this book, that number may have changed yet again. While most autism researchers focus on either environmental or genetic causes of autism, Lyons-Weiler's opus demonstrates that to fully understand the condition and to finally put its rate on the decrease, it is essential to pay attention to the science showing how the two classes of factors interact.

I offer this book as a stimulant for free and open consideration of the effects of policy based on science that is bent by the overwhelming agenda of profit. This November 2016 release is a complete paradigm shift the likes of which I've never seen. After 4 years of research on autism, genetics, immunity and disease, attempting to understand and treat my son's autism, this one book brings it all together. Where are we as a society, as a scientific community, if we attack a person who publishes a study recommending more research on the issue (as nearly EVERY scientific paper does). Frankly, I thought the movie VAXXED barely scraped the iceberg on the possible link between vaccines and autism. You'd be better served by first watching the hundreds of testimonials being captured and posted on YouTube as part of the VAXXED bus tour. This is perhaps THE MOST IMPORTANT story in medicine right now. The public needs to know whether vaccines are safe for each and every individual. A vaccine schedule that has accelerated from 12 to 72 vaccines in the last 30 years

without any collective research as to the possible effects of not just Mercury and aluminum, not just the additives like polysorbate 80 and mono sodium glutamate, but the viral strains themselves. Presuming viruses as static entities, unable to mutate into more dangerous and virulent strains denies all we know and have learned about infectious disease in the last 300 years. Finally, Dr. Paul Offit, an apostle of the darkest nature, who has done more damage to scientific discovery and public health than any medical professional in history, who states that you can safely have 10,000 vaccines on the same day (revised from his original 'scientific' estimate of 100,000), I say 'TRY IT YOURSELF'!

If you believe that autism is a mysterious condition with no known cause, or that autism is strictly a genetic disease, or that it has been proven conclusively that vaccines don't cause autism, then you need to read this book! Dr. Lyons-Weiler, an evolutionary geneticist with a strong background in molecular medicine, proteomics and systems biology, is the ideal person to answer the question: what causes autism? In this book, you will learn not only of the myriad genetic variants linked to autism, but also, more importantly, of the various environmental factors that play at least as important a role as genetics. Some examples -- the inhaler terbutaline used to treat asthma, valproic acid used to treat seizures, acetaminophen to curb fever, especially following vaccination, and glyphosate, the active ingredient in the pervasive herbicide, Roundup. Lyons-Weiler also discusses the evidence supporting a link between vaccines and autism, particularly the controversial MMR vaccine. He emphasizes the connection between gut dysbiosis and autism, and proposes that peptides entering the brain cause autoimmune responses that result in inflammation leading to brain injury. This book is very accessible to the general audience while at the same time being comprehensive and well documented, with a long list of references to the research literature to back up his claims and inform the scholar who wants to probe more deeply into the topic. This book is arguably the most comprehensive resource available today to answer the mystery of autism.
