If you think you know what this book is about, think again! Unthinkable Sins is full of secrets, lies and

deceit. It is the story on the undeniable love a mother has for her sons and the lengths she will go to in order to protect and provide for them. At one point I wondered if I were reading a script from the T.V. series, "Empire" Ms. Quarles-Sanders does an excellent job of keeping the reader engaged and motivated to continue reading. With less than 150 pages, it was a quick read, however with the number of characters and transitioning from present to past and back again, it had the feel of a longer novel. I can "acquaint" this read to a family's Thanksgiving Dinner - I enjoyed the revelations and confessions being "spooned" out delicately vs being served up like a heaping scoop of mashed potatoes, as if everyone is in a rush to complete the meal.
